Federal and state-funded environmental projects on Coochie will be showcased during a Field Trip during this year's National Landcare conference in Brisbane in October.

south-east Queensland and several hundred participants are expected



The saturated steam weeding and revegetation project funded by a Community Sustainability grant from the Queensland government is delivering positive results and putting a smile on faces of volunteers.

Thanks to Chris Leonard, Heather Smith, David Kemp and Graeme Roberts-Thomson who gained Certificates of Competency to operate the Satusteam 800 machine along with QYAC Rangers, Jimmy Martin, Mark Jones, Lorde Walker, Jacob Martin and Brandon Martin we're comfortably meeting project milestones. Last month we welcomed another four trainee operators – Andrew Ross, Luke Turnbull, Bryan Dyball and David O'Hagan to the team.

Three treatments of primary sites appear to have significantly depleted the weed seed bank resulting in minimal regrowth.

The grant supports us to work alongside Traditional Owners undertaking non-toxic steam weed control around foreshore zones, helping to protect the receiving waters of the Moreton Bay Marine Park and Ramsar wetlands. It also provides for almost 2500 native grasses, shrubs and trees to revegetate denuded foreshore maintained by Coastcare and Bushcare as well as supplies for the island's native nursery.

At this stage we've successfully targeted carpets of Mothers of Million and the Satusteam 800 is also working well on guinea grass and Singapore Daisy.

#### BMT WBM to develop Shoreline Erosion Management Plan

Redland City Council has finalised the procurement phase for a consultancy to develop a Coochiemudlo Island Shoreline Erosion Management Plan (SEMP) in line with agreed consultant specification.

**BMT WBM** www.bmtwbm.com.au was the successful applicant with Jessie Cullen and Malcolm Andrews leading the team.

The SEMP planning process was re-started last year with the appointment of a community reference group working towards the selection of a firm to lead the study.

The consultancy team will be introduced at the next community reference group in the next few weeks and community consultation will follow.

In 2013, BMT WBM was appointed to undertake a Shoreline Erosion Management Plan for the island A **draft Norfolk Beach Shoreline Erosion Management Plan** released by Council in 2014 and finalised as a Study in August 2015 can be accessed in the link in the right hand column – Norfolk Beach Report.

#### **News in Brief**

- Sincere thanks to Cr Hewlett for providing a Councillor's Small Grant for replacement dune signage which had faded after five years. As well, we also have a steam spike set for the saturated steam weeder that will allow us to tackle deeprooted, woody weeds and prickly pear.
- Great to hear <u>Conservation Volunteers Australia</u> have allocated six days for
  weeding and rehabilitation work on Coochiemudlo over the next couple of months
  with teams of up to 10 people. We understand five of the days are funded under a
  Threatened Species Grant while insurance firm, Aon is sponsoring another on
  September 7 (Threatened Species Day) We look forward to developing a closer
  working relationship with CVA to care for our beautiful island.
- The GHD contamination investigation and groundwater sampling continues around the closed landfill site that is Laurie Burns Recreation Reserve and Melaleuca Wetlands. The study, originally expected to finish at the end by the of July has been delayed for several more weeks. Background detail available via this link.
