Happy New Year to members and friends. With your support, Coastcare looks forward to a rewarding 2020 as our volunteer organisation continues working with government, network partners and Traditional Owners, the Quandamooka People, to strengthen the resilience of our island home.

With the seventh anniversary of the devastating storm surge from ex-tropical Cyclone Oswald looming on the Australia Day weekend, we're reminded of the fragility of the shoreline. Our Heritage-listed Emerald Fringe is at risk including the trees graveyard in the north-east, the Melaleuca Wetlands and historic Norfolk Beach where veteran trees hang at risk and eroded access paths have been closed by Council.

While a Shoreline Erosion Management Plan (SEMP) has been underway for the past two years, it's clear the island needs urgent committed action to address erosion issues.

undertake weed reduction and rehabilitation work across the Melaleuca Wetlands as part of the "Coochiemudlo Island Wetland Weed Control Project - 2019-2023 *Protecting threatened species and Ramsar values".*

As Project Managers, Coastcare will work with Healthy Land and Water, supported by Redland City Council, to reduce threats and restore habitat in and around the 19.5hectare freshwater wetlands, part of the Moreton Bay Ramsar site. The wetlands have high cultural and ecological values and are home to over 170-recorded native plant species including endangered orchids and fungi. They provide habitat for over 100 bird species, native animals and invertebrates.

Melaleuca Wetlands have been diminished in south-east Queensland due to coastal development pressures, hence the preservation of this wetland is important not only for the ecosystem services it provides to Ramsar but also as a remnant of this vegetation type.

Monitoring restoration outcomes will play an important role in the carefully staged chemical-free operations across hot-spot locations. Quadrats have been established and will be evaluated for weed reduction and native regeneration over four years.

Contractors who undertook initial works last month, including removal of over 100 cocos palms, will return soon to complete another 14 days for the current financial year.

Coochiemudlo Island Coastcare has been caring for the environment since 2013 and its members are passionate about undertaking ecosystem protection and restoration activities without the use of chemicals. This approach prevents chemicals leaching through the Island's sandy soils and into the groundwater and Moreton Bay.

Volunteers who undertake working bees to remove weeds and restore habitat east of the walking track will help maintain the site past the project completion date to improve restoration outcomes in the longer term.
