


## Our highest count to date!

Thank you to all our Curlew counters who took part in the count this year. Fifty volunteers - including 16 island residents (absolutely fantastic to see so many of you - thank you for joining in) - counted a total of 233 birds (187 adults, 40 juveniles, 4 chicks and 2 eggs). There were also 18 tagged birds recorded.

This has been our highest count since 2018 where 216 curlews were recorded, but remember, we never claim that we count all the curlews on the island.

The Coochie Curlew Count is one of the longest running citizen science projects in the Redlands and this year it was lovely to have the assistance of the Victoria Point Girl Guides. They were very interested in learning about the curlews, being on an island and some of the girls had a complete nature lesson. They were a delight to have on the count and we hope you had a great time. Thank you Vic Pt Girl Guides.

# **Shoreline Erosion Management Plan approved by Council**

Coochiemudlo Island's Shoreline Erosion Management Plan was unanimously passed by Redland City Council at its February meeting.

Thanks to members of the Community Reference Group (CRG) who hung-in for three years of meetings, in particular, retired coastal engineer, Dr Michael Gourlay who shared his extensive observations and research over 28 years. Thanks also to CRG Chair, Cr Lance Hewlett and Kim Richards, MP for Redlands for their unswerving support of the island.

It's been a long eight years since reparation works after the devastating storm surge of ex-TC Oswald sharpened focus on our shoreline.

For Coochie, it's a major step forward, managing heritage-listed Norfolk Beach, the Emerald Fringe and Ramsar wetlands with ensuing values acknowledged in Council's 2020-21 Operational Plan, Vision Outcomes 3. Embracing the Bay.
