World Wetlands Day volunteers removing vines strangling trees

February has seen an action-packed start to Coastcare's year with working bees in the wetlands, the Curlew Count, approval of plans for our long-awaited Environmental Hub, and a workshop on Queensland's tourism future.

It was also a pleasure to welcome Grade 12 geography students from Ormiston College undertaking a study of the Melaleuca Wetlands and comparing results against a previous investigation in 2020. Students were keen to see how landcover transformations, due to increases in the urban footprint, tourism and marine traffic impact the RAMSAR-listed wetland. With insights from Jennah Williams, Esri Australia and guidance from staff they utilised industry standard geospatial technologies to survey the foreshore and record erosion detail, habitat change, and weed threats to this protected area, so crucial for wildlife and coastal protection.

It was an inspiring day of learning on Coochiemudlo and augurs well for the future of the soon-to-be operational Moreton Bay Environmental Centre campus.

After the Queensland government's recent \$1 million investment upgrading this facility, we look forward to a progress report from the Member for Redlands, Rebecca Young who has been liaising with the Education Minister's office on resourcing detail.

Coochie Curlew Count sets a 25 year record

The Bush stone curlews were waiting to be counted on island on Saturday 8 February and the result was a record. 264 birds, including chicks and adults.

The highest previous count was 232 in 2020.

Redland City Council wildlife officer, Lisa Bailey organised the event supported by volunteers from

Coochiemudlo assisted by a good number of residents from Victoria Point and Cleveland.

The count started at 4.30pm and it was finished by 6.00pm with time for a barbecue and catching the 6.45 ferry.

Beware of Cenchrus echinatus

Recent years has seen the appearance of Mossman River grass *Cenchrus echinatus* on Coochiemudlo Island, a weed that loves sandy soils.

It is a nasty one with spikey burrs which can penetrate the hides of livestock and is therefore a problem in recreation areas.

Please keep an eye out for this weed. If found, pull out the whole plant and dispose appropriately and then monitor the area where you found it as its sure to have already set seed in the vicinity.
