We welcome participation of members, especially newcomers, who would like to be more actively involved in the environmental management of the island especially our conservation foreshores and wetland workzones.

After formalities, we'll welcome guest speaker Paul Donatiu who manages the Queensland Threatened Plant Network, a joint initiative of the Australian Network for Plant Conservation and the Queensland Threatened Species Program.

We look forward to his presentation, *"Current and emerging issues in plant conservation."* Paul has a study background in architecture, psychology and environmental management, and has practised community development and community education. He has worked for WWF, Greening Australia, Queensland National Parks Association, Griffith University and Healthy Land and Water. Apart from species recovery, Paul's fields of interest include ecological restoration, fire ecology, landscape ecology, and the management and preservation of cultural landscapes.

Paul has also completed a Churchill Fellowship that examined how five national agencies in Europe, USA and South Africa were dealing with climate impacts on their protected areas.

## Damage toll from Tropical Cyclone Alfred continues to mount

Three months after the event, Coochiemudlo Island is still reeling from the effects of TC Alfred and sadly there's no firm indication of a restoration timeline.

Our heritage-listed foreshores, stripped of sand and undermined by storm-water erosion stand as stark reminder of a disaster that caused extensive damage to natural and built infrastructure.



Countless casuarinas cling to the battered shoreline with roots totally exposed and it's only a matter of time before they succumb to high tides on beaches denuded of sand Recovery efforts to date have focussed on tree and vegetation removal while several of the major access paths have been cordoned off, their fate resting on anticipated disaster funding.



We're grateful for the attention of Council officers in the early weeks and last month's visit by Cr Hewlett, Group Managers, Sherry Clarke and Brad Salton along with engineers, planners and ecologists. The guidelines for recovery are spelt-out in the island's 2020 Shoreline Erosion Management Plan with emphasis that sand replenishment needs to be undertaken within three months to reduce the high risk of damage from a repeat erosion event.

Coastcare has been advised that beach nourishment will be undertaken to Norfolk and Main Beaches while sand will be re-instated around eroded trees in multiple locations. Access tracks and storm-water overland flow rectification is also planned for numerous locations on Main, Outriggers and Norfolk Beach. 3 June 2025 News Update
